

The Am'r Language Dictionary

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AM'R WORD • DEFINITION

adharmhem • one who endangers am'r as a whole, or the act of endangering the am'r as whole

ahstha • coma am'r fall into when deprived off too much blood and/or oxygen

am'r (*sing. & pl.*) • commonly known as a “vampire”

am'r-nafsh (*sing. & pl.*) • A living human being who shared blood with an am'r three times, but not yet died.

Aojasc' am'ratv! • “Strength and immortality!”

aojysht (*sing.*), **aojyshtaish** (*pl.*) • am'r elder, am'r elders

bakheb-vhoonho • giver of blood, used for am'r who give blood to other am'r or kee; used for the stronger blood going to the weaker, whether am'r or kee

cinyaa • my lover

esteshcinast • *verb*: to know by smell, specifically to recognize the vhoon-anghyaa of other am'r (Present tense: "I esteshcinasti", past tense "I have esteshcinastii")

fraheshteshnesh • first blood meal as a newly awoken am'r

frangkhilaat • to feed / take nutrition from a kee

frithaputhra (*sing.*), -ish (*pl.*) • “beloved child”, title used by a am'r for an am'r / am'r-nafsh made with the former's blood

gharpatar • grandfather, maker of my maker

izchha (*sing.*), -ish (*pl.*) • a “sacrifice”, a mortal who is selected to donate blood (with or without sex)

kee (*sing. & pl.*) • mortal, non-vampire, living human being

maadak • intoxicating drink; effects am'r like strong hallucinogen / tranquilizer

maadakyō • corrupted with maadak, a mortal who has drunk maadak

pat'rkosh • patar-killer

patar • “parent” or “maker”; title used by a am'r or am'r-nafsh for the am'r who made them

tokhmarenc • dying the final death; "giving the tokhmarenc" is killing another am'r so they cannot rise again

vhoon • blood

vhoon-anghyaa • blood influence, blood-line, the traits that come down from your patar; also the smell of your patar in your blood

vhoon-berefteh • to be bled

vhoon-vaa • am'r-style healing with blood

vhoon-vayon • am'r love making, with other am'r or am'r-nafsh

vistarascha • dying the mortal death; becoming am'r
